

FROM THE AIRPORT TO BARCELONA

Barcelona is known for its international airport called El Prat, which has two terminals: the T1 and the T2. Both terminals are connected by a shuttle service every 8 minutes.

The airport is located 18km from the south of the city. More than a hundred airlines connect with two hundred destinations worldwide.

If you arrive by plane, there are several ways to get to the city centre:

1 AEROBÚS

It consist of a bus service that rapidly connects both terminals with Plaça Catalunya (25-35 minutes). The Aerobus A1 line is linked with the T1 and the A2 line with the T2. It runs every day from 05:30am to 1am.

2 TRAIN

The Catalan Regional Railway (Rodalies de Catalunya) R2 North line connects the second terminal with Sants station (19 min), Passeig de Gràcia (26 min) and Clot-Aragó (30 min). It runs every day from 06:00am to 11:30pm.

3 TAXI

In the airport you will always find taxis available anytime at both terminals. The service from or to the airport involves an additional fee and a charge for each suitcase transported.

One hundred km from Barcelona there is Girona's Airport, where low-cost airlines run.

FROM BARCELONA TO MATARÓ

1 TRAIN

Take the train R1 line (Barcelona stations: Sants-Estació, Plaça de Catalunya, Arc de Triomf, El Clot-Aragó) until Mataró station. Some trains finish their route in Mataró and some others continue until Blanes, Maçanet-Massanes, Arenys de Mar o Portbou, but all of them stop at Mataró. You can check the schedules on www.renfe.es

TIP: we suggest you to buy the AB RECURRENT tickets, which is valid for 3 months, it costs 10€ and you can geit it at any railway station. After these months, if it has been used over 16 times, they'll return you the money.

2 BUS

You can take as well the "Casas" bus number E11.1 (in Barcelona, it stops in Ronda Universitat, 21 and Plaça Tetuán):

- E11.1 Barcelona Mataró (centre)
- E11.2 Barcelona Mataró (north)

TIP: we suggest you to purchase a multi-journey ticket for 10 trips (T-Casual 3 zones), valid for train and buses in Mataró, and for train, buses, tram and underground in Barcelona. It costs 30,50 € and you can get it at any underground or railway station or any press kiosk. You can plan your trip and check the public transport schedules here: http://mou-te.gencat.cat/

3 CAR

If you choose to take a car, follow the next steps:

- Take the highway C-32 north direction to Mataró / Girona
- Leave the highway at the exit "Mataró Sud" (about 25 minutes from Barcelona).
- You will see a big roundabout with a huge metal sculpture in the middle of it. Take the second exit.
- You will find TecnoCampus on your right.
