




STUDENTS





OCTOBER PROJECTED NEW BUILDING IN THE IVECO-PEGASO AREA

At a press conference, the mayor of Mataró and president of TecnoCampus, David Bote, announced that planning is underway for a new building to be located in the Iveco-Pegaso area. Bote explained that the aim is to establish a public-private partnership to finance the investment, and that the project envisions a multipurpose building capable of hosting business activity as well as university programmes or higher vocational training.

JANUARY STUDY ON HEALTH AND SPORT

Researchers at TecnoCampus launched a study on health and sport in collaboration with the Germans Trias i Pujol Hospital. The three-month study involved TecnoCampus students and researchers, as well as professionals from the Badalona-based hospital. Scientific evidence has widely demonstrated the benefits of physical exercise for mental and emotional health, both in prevention and in treatment.

FEBRUARY FIFTH EDITION OF THE TECNOGIRL PROGRAM

In February, activities began for the 5th edition of TecnoGirl, a programme that promotes the active participation of girls in fields with low female representation, such as STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics). Through workshops, talks and hands-on activities, the programme aims to inspire young women to explore science and technology as a future pathway full of opportunities.






MARCH INAUGURATION OF THE NEW GASTRONOMY LAB AT TECNOCAMPUS



The event was attended by 46 students from different secondary schools in the Maresme region and from TecnoCampus itself.
